International application for an Australian child support assessment (CS1665)

When to use this form



Only use this form if you live outside Australia and want to:

- apply for an initial child support assessment
- restart a previously ended child support assessment
- add another child to an existing child support assessment.

You can only use this form if you are the natural or adoptive parent of the child(ren) of the child support assessment.

Important information What is a child support assessment?

A child support assessment is based on the principle that parents need to meet the costs of raising their child(ren). The child support assessment takes into account a number of factors including both parents' incomes, how much time each parent cares for the child(ren) and responsibility for children from other relationships. This is to ensure the child(ren) of the assessment receive a proper level of financial support from their parents.

Services Australia can work out the child support payment amount, using a formula that can account for different family circumstances. We can collect the payments and transfer them on your behalf (known as Child Support Collect) or you can choose to transfer the payments independent of us (known as Private Collect). If you choose Child Support Collect, the method of collecting and transferring payments will depend on the residential arrangements of the parent receiving the child support.

Australia has arrangements for child support with a number of countries. These are known as **reciprocating jurisdictions**. A reciprocating jurisdiction is a country or part of a country that has an international arrangement with Australia. A list of countries with reciprocating jurisdiction can be found at **servicesaustralia.gov.au/childsupportjurisdictions**

If you are in a **non-reciprocating jurisdiction**, you may not be eligible for an Australian child support assessment. You should contact Services Australia or the authority responsible for child support in your country of residence to discuss your options.

In making an application for Australian child support you may be required to provide additional documents with this form. For example, copies of the birth certificate for your child(ren) or other supporting documentation to prove parentage of your child(ren).

Information about eligibility

When applying for an Australian child support assessment there are specific eligibility criteria that apply. You must meet all of these eligibility requirements to be eligible for an assessment.

- At least one parent must be a resident of Australia on the day the application is made.
- The parent required to pay child support must live in Australia or a reciprocating jurisdiction.
- You must not be currently living in a genuine domestic relationship with the other parent.
- The child(ren) must be under 18, unmarried and not living in a de-facto relationship.
- The child(ren) must be either usually living in Australia (or a country that is a reciprocating jurisdiction)
 or an Australian citizen.
- We are satisfied that you and the other parent are the parents of the child(ren).

Gross income includes gross income from wages before tax, taxable pension/benefits, business income, rental income, investment income, net capital gains and eligible terminations payments. Include any other assessable income that would be included in your tax return.

Allowable tax deductions must be recognised by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) for example, work related expenses, business expenses, rental property expenses, financial investment expenses.

Total net investment losses are the amount by which the expenses for your investments for example, from rental property, shares, managed investments and forestry managed investment schemes, exceed the gross income from those investments.

Reportable fringe benefits includes benefits received as part of earned income but not as a wage or salary for example, novated lease, use of a car as part of a salary package.

Target foreign income includes any foreign income exempt from tax, less any losses or outgoings incurred in deriving that income.

Total tax free pensions and benefits — Not all tax free pensions and benefits need to be included as adjusted taxable income. The following examples are to be **included** as they may be considered for child support purposes: disability support pensions, Carer Payment, invalidity service pensions, partner service pensions, income support supplements and Defence Force Income Support Allowances.

Reportable superannuation contributions are when you choose to salary sacrifice some of your wages into a superannuation fund. These are in addition to the compulsory contributions paid by your employer. If you are self-employed, these are the superannuation payments you make that you claim as a tax deduction.
