Securing the National Disability Insurance Scheme for future generations

The Fraud Fusion Taskforce (FFT) is a multi-agency partnership co-led by the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) and Services Australia. The FFT works to disrupt fraud and criminal activity, including serious and organised crime, and those seeking to exploit government programs and payments.

The FFT began on 1 July 2023. It enables intelligence-sharing, identification and response by member agencies to fraud carried out by serious organised crime entities.

Other member agencies include:

- Australian Federal Police
- Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission
- Australian Taxation Office
- Commonwealth Director of Public Prosecutions
- Department of Education.

Services Australia will get \$65.2 million over 4 financial years to extend the agency's involvement in the FFT.

This funding will be used to continue the work of the FFT to:

- gather intelligence
- conduct fraud investigations
- prosecute and recover debt
- provide forensic services capability to member agencies.

This measure isn't subject to legislation passing.

Who this measure affects

This affects people and providers who may be subject to fraud investigations and people who are victims of identity crime.

When this starts and finishes

This measure starts on 1 July 2026 and will end on 30 June 2030.
