



Tasmanian Freight Equalisation Scheme

Additional information – intrastate horses

(TAS033)

When to use this form

Use this form to provide details about a horse being shipped between the Bass Strait Islands and the main island of Tasmania. Use a separate **TAS033** form for each horse claimed (one horse per form).

This form must accompany a Tasmanian Freight Equalisation Scheme (TFES) claim for horse(s).

Tasmanian Freight Equalisation Scheme horse claims

You may be eligible to claim assistance when you ship a horse (including foals), between the Bass Strait Islands and the main island of Tasmania.

You must have incurred and paid the cost of shipment.

Important information

Intrastate horse – You may be eligible to receive assistance for horses shipped between the main island of Tasmania and King Island or the Furneaux Group, for permanent use or sale.

Brood mare round trip – You may be eligible to receive assistance for King Island or Furneaux Group based brood mares, that are shipped to the main island of Tasmania for servicing and return.

Assistance is available for both the northbound and southbound legs of the round trip.

Both legs of the round trip must be completed before the claim is submitted.

Claims for brood mares on a round trip must be claimed within 6 months of date of shipment of the return leg.

Foals born from eligible brood mares may be eligible for assistance on the return leg, if they are less than 6 months old at the time of shipment.

Sportpersons or professional entertainers horse round trip – Sportpersons and professional entertainers may be eligible to claim assistance for horses that are shipped on a round trip between the main island of Tasmania and King Island or Furneaux Group. Assistance is available for the return leg.

If the horse is being used for entertainment, you must be a professional entertainer who is receiving an income, fee or financial reward from performing in a show or event.

If the horse is being used in a sporting event, you must be a sportsperson who is competing in a sporting event where prize money or other financial reward is offered.

A round trip consists of an outward and return shipment of the same horse within a 6 month period.

Both legs of the round trip must be completed before the claim is submitted. Claims must be lodged within 6 months of date of shipment of the return leg.

In addition to this form, you must also lodge a **Sportsperson and Professional Entertainers (TAS008)** form with your claim.
