DATA DESCRIPTIONS

Recipients of Youth Allowance (student and apprentice) and Austudy who are current (i.e. entitled to be paid).

Commonwealth Electorate Divisions are based on the recipient's geo-coded address against the Australian Statistical Geography Standard (ASGS) 2011. Since the published December 2012 electorate data, the methodology to determine electorate distribution has been refined and the Commonwealth Electorate Divisions have been updated from the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) 2010 Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC) classification to the ABS 2011 ASGS classification. As such, the data by electorate for March 2013 onwards is not directly comparable to data published for previous quarters.

NOTE: In order to protect individuals' privacy, populations <20 are reported as "<20".
